- Be at the first semester of "Cozinheiro Chefe Internacional" or second semester of "Tecnologia em Gastronomia" or be a graduate of either program at **Senac**.
- Have a minimum of overall 5.0 IELTS (with min. 5.0 in speaking and writing bands) or overall 40-49 TOEFL (with min. 15 speaking and 14 writing).
- Be 18 years of age or older at the time of registration.

Fee

\$3,510

This includes program tuition fee, ancillary fees (including materials fees, product costs, and textbooks), field trips as per schedule, health insurance (July 1-31, 2014) uniforms and tools (to be returned to George Brown College upon program completion).

Students are required to bring black safety shoes from SENAC.

Accommodation
